Something to Think About

There is the story of an art collector who purchased a Picasso at quite a hefty price and brought the painting to the artist for his comments on it. Picasso looked at the painting and said, "It's a fake." Disappointed the collector returned home to his collection. A year later he picked up another Picasso from his collection and returned to the artist for his evaluation. Again Picasso stated, "It's a fake." This time the collector protested and said, "When I was here last year I saw you working on this. I waited till it came on the market, and I purchased it from a reputable dealer." "Yes, that is possible," replied Picasso, "I often paint fakes."

We often refer to life as art, the "art of living." Each year on this Yamim Noraim we briefly step back from the canvas upon which we're living our lives and ask, Is our art authentic or are we painting fakes? Are we living lives of coherence, integrity, and high purpose or are we allowing our judgements and our behavior to be unduly influenced by the artistic faking that so often surrounds us.

Authenticity arises from an awareness of an attachment to those values of our tradition that are deeply rooted in time. The attentive and thoughtful observance of the High Holy Days requires us to pay close and careful attention to the words of the liturgy. In so doing, it is hoped that the canvas of each life may be made more authentic,
